

1. Divisions 1.4S and Classes 6 and 7 are not included in Table 9.3.A as they do not require segregation from other classes of dangerous goods.
2. IATA DGR Section 9.3.2.1.3 — Class 9 segregation only applies to Lithium Batteries prepared in accordance with Section 1A or 1B of Packing Instructions 965 and 968.
3. IATA DGR Section 9.3.2.2 — Class 1 segregation is dependent on the “Compatibility Group” of the explosive. With the exception of Division 1.4B, which may only be loaded with Division 1.4S, explosives of the same Compatibility Group may be loaded together regardless of Division. Division 1.4S do not require segregation.
