

COURSES Dangerous Goods by Air: Awareness - Cabin Crew

One half day course, CBT or paper-based correspondence

Purpose

This course helps people interpret and apply the International Air Transport Association (IATA) Dangerous Goods Regulations (DGR), which is pertinent for all air transportation, internationally.

What you get

Based on the current edition of the International Air Transportation (IATA) Dangerous Goods Regulations (DGR), this course covers the recognition of dangerous goods, passenger allowances and incident response of dangerous goods in the aircraft cabin. It also provides an understanding of procedures that will help detect hidden hazards when assisting with passenger's baggage. This course will not qualify you to accept dangerous goods.

The syllabus is in accordance with the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) regulations. The IATA regulations are not required to complete this course, but access to a copy would be of benefit.

Course Qualification and Recognition

This course is approved by:

The Civil Aviation Safety Authority of Australia (CASA).

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an end-of-course questionnaire and the qualification is valid for **TWO YEARS**.

The course is developed and controlled by CASA approved dangerous goods instructors with certificate IV in workplace training and assessment or equivalent.

Who Should Attend?

Cabin Crew and Passenger Handling Staff (passenger check-in): The course is required under CASA legislation for airline cabin crew (*Employee Group D personnel and E Personnel for Passenger Handling, IATA Category 9& 11)* involved with acceptance and/or handling of passengers and their luggage (**but not the acceptance of dangerous goods**).

This course is not suitable for Flight Crew or Ground Handling Agents.

Level of Competency

Participants must have basic levels of literacy, numeracy and English comprehension. No previous experience with air transport is required.

Availability

This course can be undertaken by paper-based correspondence, on-line through our website, or classroom participation - classroom dates are set based on demand.
