

COURSES Dangerous Goods by Air Transporting Flammable Liquids

One half day course, CBT or paper-based correspondence

Purpose

If you send flammable liquids by air then this is the course for you. This course assists shippers of flammable liquids to interpret and apply the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations to shipments being sent by air domestically and internationally. Full compliance with the Regulations and an understanding of the concepts behind them will ensure the safety of all who travel and protect shippers from unknowingly committing unlawful acts.

What you get

This course will help you apply the classification, packaging, marking and labeling and documentation requirements of the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations to shipments of flammable liquids travelling by air and understand the requirements set down by the Regulatory authorities.

Access to a copy of the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations is not required though is, however, recommended.

Course Qualification and Recognition

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an end-of-course questionnaire and the qualification is valid for **TWO YEARS**.

Who Should Attend?

This course is suitable for people involved with the packaging, documentation or control of flammable liquids sent by air.

Participants must have basic levels of literacy, numeracy and English comprehension. No previous experience with air transport is required.
