

COURSE Dangerous Goods by Air Transporting Biological Substances Cat B

4 hours in class, by Correspondence, CBT on-line or Virtual Classroom

Purpose

If you send infectious substances, that are not Cat A, by international or domestic air transport, then this is the course for you. The aim of the course is to assist shippers of Biological Substances, Category B, UN 3373, to interpret and apply the International Air Transport Association Dangerous Goods Regulations (IATA DGR). Full compliance with the IATA DGR and associated Australian legislation, together with an understanding of the underpinning concepts behind these Regulations, will protect shippers from unknowingly committing unlawful acts in aviation, thereby ensuring the safety of all those who handle air freight or travel by air.

What you get

This course will help you apply the classification, packaging, marking, labeling and documentation requirements of the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations to shipments of Category B infectious substances travelling by air.

The course covers:

UN 3373 Biological Substances Category B, UN 3373

Exempt Human and Animal specimens;

Dry ice, and cryogenic liquids in dry shippers, used as refrigerants; and

Excepted quantities of ethanol, formaldehyde and formalin.

Access to a copy of the IATA DGR is not required though is, however, recommended.

Course Qualification and Recognition

This course is approved by:

• The Civil Aviation Safety Authority of Australia (CASA).

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an end-of-course questionnaire and the qualification is valid for **TWO YEARS**.

Who Should Attend?

This course has been customized for people involved with the packaging, documentation or control of Category B infectious substances and Diagnostic Specimens being transported by air. This includes people transporting materials for pathology organizations, or persons and or organizations undertaking medical trials and research.

Level of Competency

No previous knowledge or experience with air transport is required to complete the course.

This course can be undertaken by paper-based correspondence or on-line computer-based training. Virtual classroom and face-to-face classroom participation available on request.


