Dangerous Goods by Air - Transporting Dry Ice

CBT on-line

Purpose

If you send clinical specimens, blood samples, frozen foods or any item utilizing frozen carbon dioxide (dry ice) as a refrigerant, then this is the course for you. This course assists shippers to interpret and apply the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations (IATA DGR) to shipments being sent by air domestically and internationally. Full compliance with the Regulations and an understanding of the concepts behind them, and the associated Australian legislation, will ensure the safety of all who travel and protect shippers from unknowingly committing unlawful acts..

What you get

This course will help you apply the classification, packaging, marking and labeling and documentation requirements of the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations to shipments containing dry ice travelling by air.

Access to a copy of the IATA DGR is not required though is, however, recommended.

Course Qualification and Recognition

This course is approved by:

- The Civil Aviation Safety Authority of Australia (CASA).

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an end-of-course questionnaire and the qualification is valid for **TWO YEARS**.

Who Should Attend?

This course is suitable for people involved with the packaging, documentation or control of cargo that is refrigerated by dry ice being transported by air. It is a CASA requirement that any persons involved with the shipment of dry ices be trained in these requirements.

Level of Competency

No previous knowledge or experience with air transport is required to complete the course.

This course can be undertaken by on-line computer-based training.
