

COURSE

Dangerous Goods by Sea – Awareness

Four hour course or CBT on-line

Purpose

Come along and learn how to interpret and apply the International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) code and Australian Marine Orders (MO) to shipments of hazardous materials being transported by sea. Full compliance with the Code, plus an understanding of the concepts behind it, will ensure the safety of maritime transport (and of course the environment), and ensure that Australian and international laws are not broken.

The course is designed to provide a basic overview in the theory and practical aspects of shipping dangerous goods by sea. It examines the IMDG Code and provides you with a systematic approach to handling a hazardous shipment for sea transport.

Content

This course contains information on:

- Classification & Identification,
- Stowage, handling and segregation;
- Packing Cargo Transport Units (shipping containers)
- Initial emergency response

Course Qualification and Recognition

This course is recognized by:

★ The Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA). There are no formal competent authority approval requirements for this course.

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an end-of-course questionnaire. The course is based on the 2022 IMDG incorporating all the changes. Under the current AMSA and IMO training regime, the qualification is therefore valid until the 31 December 2025.

Who Should Attend?

This course is ideal for anyone needing a general understanding of shipping dangerous goods by sea.

(NOTE: Those personnel who pack, mark, label, placard, document Dangerous Goods, load or unload Cargo Transport Units with Dangerous Goods for sea transport required an AMSA Approved Full Accept course or a CTU pack course)

Level of Competency

No previous knowledge or experience with sea transport or dangerous goods is required to complete the course.
