Dangerous Goods by Sea - Transporting Batteries (inc. Lithium Batteries)

5 hour classroom course or Computer-based training

Purpose

If you send batteries, particularly lithium cells or batteries, by sea then this is the course for you. This course assists shippers of batteries, including lithium cells and batteries on their own, and in or with equipment, to interpret and apply the International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) Code to shipments being sent by sea. Full compliance with the Regulations and an understanding of the concepts behind them, will ensure the safety shipping operations and protect shippers from unknowingly committing unlawful acts. This course also covers the packaging, marking, labelling and documentation for road transport within Australia.

What you get

This course will help you apply the classification, identification, packing, marking and labeling and documentation requirements of the IMDG Code with regard to a range of battery types, and understand the requirements set down by the Regulatory authorities.

The course covers:

- Classification – Wet, dry, non-spillable or lithium ion/Polymer, Lithium metal, cell or battery;
- Identification;
- Packing, Marking and Labelling;
- Documentation; and
- Road transport shipper requirements (not cartage).

Access to a copy of the current IMDG Code is not required but is recommended.

Course qualification and recognition

This course is recognized by AMSA and Satisfies:

- IMDG Code requirements 1.3.1.2 and 1.3.1.5

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an assessment and the qualification will be valid until the next IMDG becomes mandatory.

Who should undertake the training?

This course is suitable for people involved with the packaging, documentation, or control of batteries, with particular focus on lithium batteries, and battery powered equipment being transported by sea.

Level of Competency

No previous knowledge or experience with air transport is required to complete the course.
