Dangerous Goods by Sea – Full Accept REFRESHER

One-day course, CBT on-line or Virtual Class

Purpose

Come along and learn what has changed between the current International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) code and Australian Marine Orders (MO) and the new one. We remind participants of the IMDG requirements and highlight the changes in the latest edition and how they need to be applied.

The course is designed to provide an update in the theory and practical aspects of shipping dangerous goods by sea and provide you with the information you need to ensure your work practices and procedures are in line with the changes.

Content

This course meets the AMSA and IMO syllabus requirements and includes General Awareness and Function Specific aspects for all classifications of personnel including those who identify, classify, package, mark, label, document dangerous goods and pack CTU and load vessels.

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an assessment. The course is based on the 2022 IMDG. Therefore, in accordance with AMSA and IMO Regulation, the qualification is valid until the 31 December 2025.

This course is for personnel who have successfully completed a Full Accept or Refresher course in the 2020 IMDG Code 2020 and wish to renew and update the qualification to the 2022 Code.
